Kick-start your program with a week dedicated to an orientation to the program including the key areas of study and an opportunity for self-evaluation led by the faculty who will be teaching you.

Professional Development Workshops

Students will choose 3 of 5 professional development workshops in which to participate. Focused on thematic practice areas, you will have the opportunity to study alongside field instructors and current social work practitioners. A great opportunity for both learning and networking!

Reflective Practice Project (RPP)

During your practicum, you will have an opportunity to reflect on a real-world program or practice evaluation related to your field setting.

Integrative Capstone Experience (ICE)

Your graduate studies will culminate in an Integrative Capstone Experience (ICE). Students working in small groups will be given the opportunity to demonstrate the knowledge and skills they have acquired through their MSW program by engaging in a major case study exercise.
