Enrolment in the BMOS Honors Double Major modules is limited. Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission.

The four year BMOS HONORS DOUBLE MAJOR must include one of the following four Major Modules, and another Major Module from **a discipline other than Management and Organizational Studies**: MAJOR IN <u>ACCOUNTING</u> **or** MAJOR IN <u>GLOBAL COMMERCE</u> **or** MAJOR IN <u>MANAGEMENT AND ORGANIZATIONAL STUDIES</u> or **Or** MAJOR IN <u>ORGANIZATIONAL AND HUMAN RESOURCES</u>.

Admission Requirements

Students may **not** apply to the BMOS (HONORS) DOUBLE MAJOR when they apply for admission to the University.

After first year, students may apply for admission upon successful completion of first-year requirements with no failures and an average of 70% and no grade less than 60% in any of the following 3.0 principal courses:

- 1.0 from: Business 1220E.
- 0.5 course from: Calculus 1000A/B, 1100A/B or Mathematics 1225A/B.*
- 0.5 course from: Calculus 1301A/B, 1501A/B, Mathematics 1600A/B or 1229A/B.*
- 1.0 from: Economics 1021A/B and 1022A/B.

NOTE: 1.0 Political Science 1020E is a required part of 5.0 first year courses for MAJOR IN GLOBAL COMMERCE

1.0 Sociology 1020, 1021E or Psychology 1020 is recommended first year for MAJOR IN ORGANIZATIONAL AND HUMAN RESOURCES

*Students should choose courses from this section based on the requirements of courses in their chosen MOS Major module and their second Major module

**In the selection of first year courses, it is strongly recommended that students take a first year essay course 1000-1999(F, G or E)

In addition to meeting the above admission requirements, students must successfully complete the admission requirements for a Major module in a discipline other than Management and Organizational Studies. If admission requirements are not met for either or both of the Majors, students will not be allowed to register in the BMOS (HONORS) DOUBLE MAJOR program and will be required to apply to a BMOS Honors Specialization, a BMOS Specialization, OR to another program.

After second year, students applying for the BMOS HONORS DOUBLE MAJOR must:

- a) have achieved an average of at least 70% on the last 5.0 courses;
- b) have achieved an average of at least 70% on the 3.0 principal courses for the module;
- c) have obtained a grade of at least 60% in each course required for the module;
- d) have obtained a passing grade in each elective course;
- e) have a minimum cumulative average of 65%.

Transferring to King's BMOS Programs: Students enrolled at another affiliated university college or at the constituent university must meet the admission requirements in order to transfer into a BMOS (Honors) Double Major at King's.

Progression Requirements

To progress in the BMOS (HONORS) DOUBLE MAJOR, students must

- a) have maintained a modular average of 70% in each Major module;
- b) have obtained a minimum grade of 60% in each course required for the module;
- c) have obtained a passing grade in each elective course;
- d) have maintained a cumulative average of 65%.

Students who fail to meet these progression requirements may be eligible to apply to a BMOS Specialization or to another program.

Graduation Requirements

To graduate with a BMOS HONORS DOUBLE MAJOR degree, students must achieve a minimum average of 70% with a minimum mark of 60% in each course of each module, obtain a passing grade in each elective course, and maintain a minimum cumulative average of 65% in the 20.0 courses counted towards the BMOS HONORS DOUBLE MAJOR degree. Students with advanced standing must achieve an average of 65% on courses completed at Western.

In addition to the module requirements for the different streams, all BMOS Honors Double Major students require the following before graduation:

- 1.0 "Ethics" course, as noted on the program checklists
- 2.0 designated essay courses (E, F, or G), 1.0 at the senior level.
