SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP & RURAL MARKETS - MAKING SENSE OF BOTTOM OF THE PYRAMID

Overview of the Program

This course explores social entrepreneurship as an emerging and dynamic field. Participants will gain insights into developing social enterprises through case studies and examine the potential of social entrepreneurship as a catalyst for social change. Also the barriers, limitations and constraints to achieving sustainable impact will be discussed. In addition to analyzing the work of leading development economists, we will look at case studies of social enterprises in emerging economies as models of intervention, innovation and social change. In this course we also analyze social innovations and value co – creation practices developed by some of the organizations that are operating at the Bottom of the Pyramid (BOP)

Objective:

This course focuses on how social enterprises in emerging economies set themselves as models of intervention, innovation and social change. The key deliverables of the course are:

- To identify the potential of social entrepreneurship as a catalyst for social change and the barriers, limits and constraints it faces to achieve sustainable impact.
- To sensitize the participants with challenges and distinctive innovations characterizing the rural market
- To inculcate a deep understanding of consumer decision making in rural markets

CULTURAL EXCURSIONS

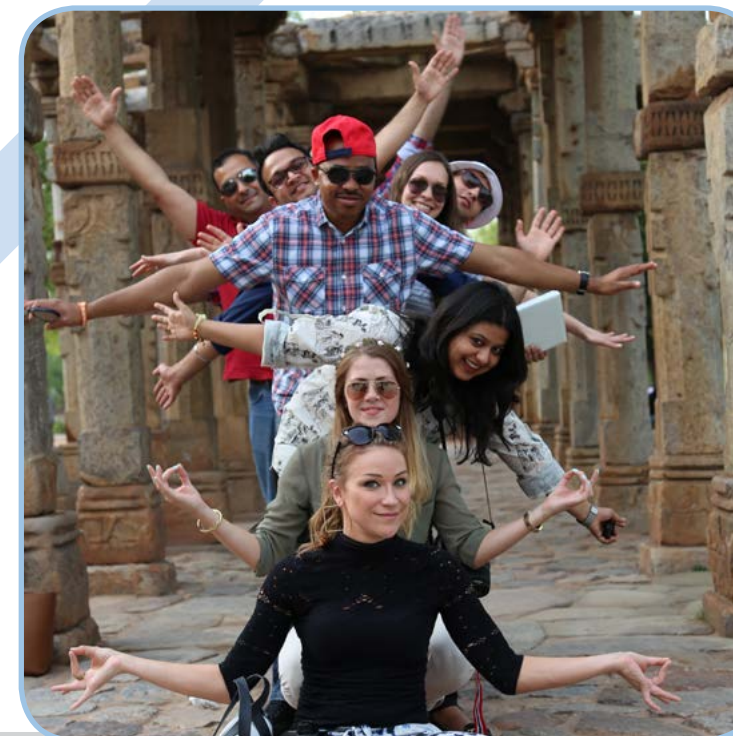
A Cultural exposure cannot be complete without connecting the International participants to the roots of India’s rich culture heritage. The International participants will also visit Agra, Delhi in addition to Rishikesh, and the holy city on the banks of the River Ganges. The India experience will be unlike anything international students have done before.

The participants will develop inter-cultural competencies by experiencing the true Indian culture by visiting these places.

The programme includes classroom sessions, visit to an NGO, visit to a School, Industry visits along with cultural excursions including visits to monuments of historical and religious significance. The class-room sessions provides a perspective into the growth of Social Entrepreneurship in the Indian Economy. The visit to an NGO provides an insight into the organization’s methods of achieving its goal of challenging socio-economic inequalities, the industry visits provides an insight into the growth of the Indian economy, while the excursions to the Qutab Minar and Taj Mahal in Agra gives the participants a perspective on Indian History, Art, Culture, Rituals and Religious sensitivities of the Indian way of life.

Delhi is the capital city of the country; rich and vibrant with its traditional cultures and history. The city is home to several educational institutions and corporate houses and offers a snapshot of the entire country. A safe and secure accommodation is provided to all students in our Gurgaon Campus.



INTERNATIONAL RESIDENCES AT IILM

IILM offers world class residential facilities for all international participants to ensure that they are comfortable during their stay

All the rooms are equipped with beds, bed-side tables, wooden cabinets, racks and attached bath. Each floor is equipped with pantry services, drinking water, washing machines, fridges and microwaves for usage. The rooms have air conditioners, heaters and geysers for hot water

Residential facility is connected with Wifi and under CCTV surveillance

The premises is guarded by security personnel round the clock and installed at all exits. The main gates are connected through CCTV cameras, surveillance systems, manned commandos to provide a safe, secure and comfortable environment to all students

Cafeteria: The meals are cooked and served in the cafeteria; the meal timings and menu are shared with all the residents. A variety of cuisines are catered to feedback and specific requests are taken into account. Besides the regular buffet, the cafe also has snack counters that serve a variety of small eats and light snacks
