Dear Dr. Morgan:

Thank you for your letter with the enclosed documents relating to the nature of Catholic universities and to the particular authority delegated by Bishop Carter to the Board of Directors of King's College.

I have read, carefully, both the letter of Bishop Carter of May 25, 1972, and the resource document "The Catholic University in the Modern World". I find myself, in general, in agreement with the contents of both the letter and the document, and have no objection, whatever, to their distribution to the Board of Directors. On the contrary, I enthusiastically support your proposal to do so.

I see these documents as outlining essential principles which must govern the relationship between King's College and the Diocese of London. They are of philosophical and historical importance. Obviously, however, my approval is not to be construed as initiating any new or modifying any present arrangement between the diocese and the college. Rather, my approval is of the ideals expressed in these documents, ideals which we should continue to strive to implement in our relationship.
