


### WHAT IS IT?


Sexual Violence includes any forms of action such as:

- Doxing (giving someone's private information on the internet)
- Trans\*phobia
- Verbal/Physical abuse
- Leering (looking/gazing in an unpleasant way)
- Homophobic slurs

### WHAT DOES KING'S SAY?

Sexual Violence is “any act targeting a person’s sexuality, gender identity or gender expression...” (King’s Western University, 2016)
