What is this course about?

The most unique aspect of this course is the experiential learning trip to the Sonoran Desert region during the February 2019 Reading Week, in which students will travel to Tucson, Arizona to be immersed in the history, culture, ecology, society, and politics of the Sonoran border region. In addition to the experiential learning opportunity, students will focus in the classroom on three interrelated research clusters: cultural media and literary studies; Indigenous knowledge, migration, technology, and society; and cross-disciplinary regional comparative studies.
