



MODULE REQUIREMENTS

*ADMISSION TO THE HSP PROGRAMS ARE LIMITED. THEY REQUIRE THE COMPLETION OF FIRST-YEAR REQUIREMENTS WITH NO FAILURES AND A MINIMUM AVERAGE OF 75% ON THREE PRINCIPAL COURSES INCLUDING PSYCHOLOGY 1000 (OR 1000X), MATH 1228A/B, STATS 1024A/B, AND AN ADDITIONAL 1.0 COURSE AT THE 1000-LEVEL.





COURSE OBJECTIVE

Students design and build an academic learning e-portfolio*.

*A digital collection of students' learning within and across their Applied Psychology program module.

WHAT DO STUDENTS DO?

Students discuss their learning - skills, achievements, experiences, and insights and interests in Applications of Psychology.

Students continue to develop an understanding of theory, research, and its application to areas of Psychology.

Students engage in goal setting (days, weeks, months, years) and use evaluation frameworks to analyze their progress and next steps.










COURSE OBJECTIVE

Create a research project from start to finish under the supervision of a faculty member



WHAT DO WE DO IN THE COURSE?

- Ethics application (September)
- Compete and revise your lit review/introduction (Fall Term)
- Present intro and methods to your classmates
- Complete your methods (January)
- Final poster presentation & written thesis (March/April)
- Sessions for Grad school and other workshops



HOW DO I WORK WITH A RESEARCH SUPERVISOR?

- All 13 full time faculty at King's can supervisor your thesis <u>if they</u> are available
- You may want to work with someone who has similar research interests (e.g., cognitive, social, developmental)
- You cannot register in the course until you have secured an advisor.

HOW DO I WORK WITH A RESEARCH SUPERVISOR?

- All students currently enrolled in the thesis stream will complete a matching form by <u>March 29th</u> (using Qualtrics)
- You will be sent the link by ADO office
- Matches will be made based on research interests.
- Notification of decisions will be made by <u>April 31st</u>
- Once final grades are released additional spots may be released.
- All matching and enrollment decisions will be finalized by May 31st

You will not be evaluated or graded in any way on this form! Limit responses to one page:


- Describe the reasons why you're interested in completing a research thesis
