He also conducts parish missions and retreats at numerous schools, colleges and universities around the country. Manibusan completed a master's degree in multicultural ministries from the Franciscan School of Theology in Berkeley, California. He and his wife, Jodi, are the founders of 2 by 2 Ministries, a grass roots outreach of music, storytelling and service. Manibusan is a dynamic and eclectic speaker and musician who shares from his heart the love of Christ and the call to live our lives from our baptismal promises - in other words, live in Christ.
