How to Select your Fall/Winter 2024 Courses



Please use the following resources to help you build your timetable. Be strategic in how you select your courses to ensure you meet your course, progression, and degree requirements. Go to **https://www.kings.uwo.ca/current-students/courses-enrolment/register-in-fall-winter-courses/** and explore the information and advice we have prepared for you. To narrow your course selection down, follow the steps below:

- 1 Check your adjudication comments on the <u>Student Centre</u>: Academics > Program Status > Grade Report Progression. Make sure to review your program status for any program/module changes related to your Grade Report before you begin course registration for the next term. Your program status may impact your eligibility to access courses during course registration.
- 2 **Program Checklists** tell you what courses you need for your module(s). Check off the courses you've taken, and shortlist the ones you haven't taken. In general, please follow the program checklist for the year in which you entered your module. Refer to the **Quick Degree Checklist** for overall degree requirements.
- 3 Log in to <u>Draft my Schedule</u> to create your draft schedule(s). Be sure to check prerequisites, antirequisites, and that you are meeting King's <u>residency requirements</u>. Read course descriptions and <u>course outlines</u> carefully.

Note: when your course enrolment appointment opens, you will still need to add courses through your Student Centre. Draft my Schedule is only a draft!

- 4 Wait for your online **enrolment appointment**, which will be posted to your Student Centre 2 to 3 days before the enrolment start dates for your year of study. Your enrolment appointment time is the earliest date and time you can access course registration. Fall/Winter registration dates by year: Year 4 (July 8-12); Year 3 (July 15-19); Year 2 (July 22-26)
- 5 You are now ready to register in your courses! On the **<u>Student Centre</u>**, go to: Academics > Course Registration > Search and Add. Check out some **<u>videos</u>** on how to register in your courses.
