



Hannover International Summer School (HISSEMA): "International Management and Economics" and "German Economy and the European Union"

HISSEMA 2017 will take place from **18.07.–30.08.2016**.

International students from our partner universities gain academic experience in Germany by attending lectures in English in "International Management and Economics" and "German Economy and the European Union". During the HISSEMA three lectures with 25/30 semester periods per week will be offered. Students passing each course will receive **5 European Credits (ECTS) per class**. The **costs for the course and accommodation are 1500 €**.

HISSEMA

The German Economy and the European Union (77101) – 5 points

Block Seminar

Content: This course will provide a description of the performance of the German economy in the past and an analysis of its recent development. A special focus will be given to institutions and regulations. The following topics will be included: some historical backgrounds, the economic system and its sector, the German labor market, constitutional elements of the social security system, Germany's integration into the European Union, its development and institutions, and the World Economy. Classwork will refer to aspects of the cultural, political and educational systems and policy integration.

International Management and Economics (77202) – 5 points

Block Seminar

Content: This course will introduce students to the field of International Management and Economics. Topics will include: the basic concepts of the Theories of Macroeconomic Competitiveness and Trade, Trends in World Trade and Transnational Enterprises as well as Foreign Direct Investments. Part of the Block Seminar will also cover the topic areas of Corporate Social Responsibility and Sustainability at micro, meso and macro levels.

German Culture, Business and Language (77111) – 5 points

Block Seminar

Content: This course will provide basic German language skills as well as insights in German business administration, culture and history. In particular, the lectures taught during a 3-day-excursion to Berlin provide insights into German culture, politics and history. Students are required to make presentations, to prepare case studies, and to submit homework referring to aspects of the cultural, economic, political, and educational systems of Germany – all the topics are prepared during the lectures in class and the Berlin's study trip.
