English Proficiency

Students admitted to King's University College must be proficient in written and spoken English. We will require the following proficiency scores or higher unless your agreement states differently:

- I.E.L.T.S. (International English Language Testing System) 6.0 IELTS
- T.O.E.F.L. IBT 80 and above (reading score of 15 and above, listening score of 16 and above, and a writing score of 15 and above)
- Duolingo: 115 with 100 in each subscore
- Other standardized proficiency tests, as discussed

Exchange Information

Health Insurance

All exchange students are required to purchase the University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP) at a fixed cost of approximately \$252 per term.

Residence

Exchange students arriving in September are guaranteed space at King's if they apply by June 1st. January arrivals must apply by November 15th. Those who wish to stay in residence during the Christmas break must register by December 1st. Additional fees of \$30 per day will apply (subject to change).
