Important Dates and Deadlines:

August 1st	→ Full-Time International: 1st Installment of Tuition & Residence DUE → Part-Time International: Full Balance of Tuition & Residence DUE → Scholarship, Award, and Bursary applications open
August 15th	→ Late fees will be applied to all accounts with outstanding balances after this date. → O-Week opt-out DEADLINE for Full-Time, First Year students → Student Endowment fee opt-out DEADLINE by 11:30pm
August 22nd	→ International Work Experience (IWE) Program application opens.
September 19th	→ IWE Program application DEADLINE
September 23rd	→ USC Health and Dental Plan opt-out DEADLINE by 11:30pm → My Virtual Doctor opt-out DEADLINE by 11:30pm
September 30th	→ Scholarship and Bursary application deadline for most in-program awards at King's
November 1st	→ Full-Time International: 2nd Installment of Tuition & Residence DUE
