

Scholarship Proration Process and Parameters – COVID-19

August 2020

Continuing Scholarships for Full-Time students for 2020-2021 will be based on average on 4.0 or more courses in the previous year. Pass grades will not be counted in the average, but those courses with Pass grades will count toward the 4.0 course load.

Students eligible for a continuing scholarship, but who chose to register in 3.5 or fewer courses may submit a request to prorate their scholarship and carry over the balance toward tuition in the following ways:

- a. Tuition for summer courses in 2021 --- King's courses only
- b. Tuition for courses in 2021-2022

Students who register in 3.5 or fewer courses at the beginning of the year, but who register for additional courses for winter term, may request an increase in their scholarship, taken from the amount carried over.

NOTE: Students who take 3.5 or fewer courses will not be eligible for a Continuing Scholarship for Full-Time students for 2021-2022.

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

1. Students going into final year of program who require fewer than 4.0 courses may request a proration of their scholarship based on number of courses they are taking.
2. ACSD students who receive a prorated scholarship will not be further prorated if they are not taking a full-course load in the subsequent year.
3. Students whose programs required them to break residency in the 2020-2021 academic year may request to retain their full scholarship.
