

King's University College offers resources for media during 2022 Papal Visit

July 20, 2022

Background:

As a Catholic University, King's University College at Western University is a forum for difficult and uncomfortable truth discussions regarding faith, justice, and acknowledging historical injustices and committing ourselves to the work of truth-seeking and truth-telling about past injustices and ongoing harm.

Truth-telling is a necessary precondition to taking the first steps for reconciliation. King's offers programs in religious studies, social justice and peace studies, history and other areas where faculty, and students, research, teach and study contemporary issues related to Truth and Reconciliation (TRC), the Catholic Church, and Colonization.

In 2021, King's along with the two other affiliated university colleges at Western, Brescia and Huron, <u>hired Sean Hoogterp as an Indigenous Initiatives Coordinator and advisor</u>.

Sean Hoogterp and four King's faculty are available to share knowledge and scholarship on issues which may help media with background related to the visit by Pope Francis to Canada July 24-29, 2022.

King's as a community is committed to being a place where TRC can be openly discussed and researched and is hopeful that the Calls to Action being implemented on campus will lead to a just and truthful community for all.

- **Dr. Robert Ventresca, Interim Academic Dean and Professor, History:** Papal apologies; official apologies and restorative justice; historical wrongs and public memory; interreligious/inter-faith and intercultural dialogue; post-conflict transitions; colonial racism; church-state relations; genocide studies
- **Dr. Mark Yenson, Associate Academic Dean and Professor, Religious Studies:** Theology; Catholic Church (history, organizational structure, e.g. religious congregations); Pope Francis' thoughts and writings; missionary activity/colonization (e.g. doctrine of discovery).
- **Jess Notwell, Lecturer, Sociology:** Decolonization; 「イヘトロイム・ miyo pimâtisiwin (living respect and reciprocity with b ウ ウ ウ ウ は kahîyâw kâwâhkômakâw (All Our Relations)); global solidarities across struggles for liberation and decolonization in Palestine and on Turtle Island; Indigenous knowledges and pedagogies; settler colonialism.
